Game Position Roles

Role of the lead

The lead's tasks are to:

- Place the mat as requested by the skipper;
- Roll the jack to the length requested by the skipper;
- Try to put one bowl close to the jack and one bowl close behind.

Whether bowling first or second, the lead is the bowler who sets up the end either by having bowls in potentially scoring positions or by forcing the opponents to attack.

When rolling the jack the lead must be guided by the thoughts of the skipper in implementing the rink's game plan. It is vital that the jack is rolled close to the length requested so that the plan can be put into action. Some practice time needs to be given over to rolling the jack. The lead will not necessarily have a bowl in the count for the end but should have endeavoured to have established a platform for team-mates to build upon.

Role of the second

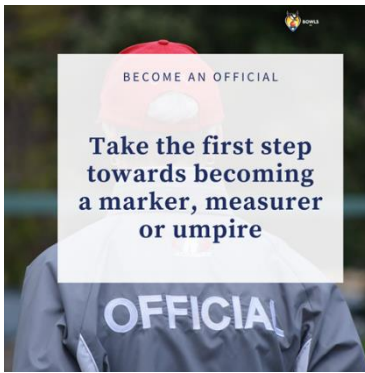
The second's tasks are to:

- Bowl to the jack as requested by the skipper;
- Bowl to a position indicted by the skipper;
- Keep the score.

Most of the time the second will be attempting to draw to a position. However there will be occasions when the skipper calls for an on-shot or drive so some practice time needs to be given over to these shots. It is quite common for the jack to be moved several times in the course of an end.

The second's task is to further develop the head if it is in a favourable condition or to start retrieving the situation if it is not.

The lead and second lay the foundation for winning.



BECOME AN OFFICIAL

Take the first step towards becoming a marker, measurer or umpire and get yourself enrolled into one of Bowls SA Officials Courses.

Bowls Australia's accreditation system is an educational pathway for people seeking to develop their skills as an official. The four accreditations are:

- Marker
- Measurer
- Umpire
- International Technical Official (ITO)

These accreditations are skill-based and require specific competencies.

You can choose to gain accreditation as a National Umpire which encompasses accreditation as a Marker and Measurer, or you can choose to just complete a Marker or Measurer accreditation depending on your interests and needs.

The final step in the Officiating pathway is the ITO. This accreditation is a World Bowls accreditation. The ITO accreditation is designed for those already accredited as National Umpires, who wish to umpire at national and international events such as the Australian Open, Commonwealth Games, and other major events.

All accreditations last for four years and after this period of time, you will need to successfully complete a re-accreditation course to maintain the qualification.
