CLUB OPENING DAY: THE START OF THE 2022-2023 SEASON



Hahndorf Bowling Club was the venue for the Minister of Recreation, Sport and Racing, Hon Katrine Hildyard MP, to officially declare the bowls season 2022-23 open and include the opening of their new veranda. A grant through the Office of Recreation, Sport and Racing provided the opportunity for the club to give bowlers, and supporters an area to socialise under cover. The veranda had been on the Club's list of additions for some time and was also supported by the Mt Barker Council.

In bright sunshine, President, Phil Nagel, welcomed the Minister, along with the Member for Heysen, Josh Teague MP, Mayor of Mt Baker Council, Ann Ferguson OAM, and Councillor for North Ward, Narelle Hardingham. The Minister spoke of the value sporting clubs provide to the wider community, especially in both physical and mental health. She commended the club for its involvement in supporting the local community by offering its facilities and providing a social and welcoming environment.

The Minister was then invited to "roll the first jack" followed by Mayor Ferguson to "roll the first bowl" to officially open the bowls season. Communication from the skipper

When you gain possession of the mat, i.e., it is your turn to bowl.

- wait behind the mat for any requests from your skipper;
- then go to the mat, and
- set yourself to deliver your bowl.

As your bowl completes its course you will know whether it has taken the path you intended. If it has not, you need to decide whether it was your intention or your execution which was at fault.

Your skipper is well-placed to evaluate your delivery or execution and provide guidance when next the mat is yours.

Most skippers realise it is better to ask you to try to bowl to a specific spot on the green rather than to merely call or signal for more grass or less weight. They also realise it is better to say, “We need a bowl here” rather than “I need a bowl here”, after all, there is no “I” in team!

You should always watch your bowl in its course as you will know if it had the line you intended and whether you will need to aim to another point subsequently. As it comes to rest you will know if it had the weight you intended and whether you need to adjust your step and arm swing.

There might be occasions when after a game your skipper asks you to practice a particular skill such as “a metre-on shot to move the jack” or “a draw shot to the jack well off-line”.

Your skipper, club-mates or club coaches should be able to provide guidance with this.
