This season's program could be seen as having three aspects, about the game, playing the game and presentations from Bowls SA representatives.

About the game included:

- Etiquette;
- The main rules;
- The roles of rink members:
- Analysing play;
- Analysing delivery;
- Green markings;
- Measuring;
- Communication from the director.

Playing the game included:

- Preparing to bowl;
- Drawing to the jack on line at various lengths:
- Drawing to the jack off line at various lengths:
- Drawing to the jack in the ditch on line and off;
- Bowling to move the jack to advantage;
- Bowling to out draw opponents' short, long or jack-high bowls.

Bowls SA representative Tony Lucas' presentation was based on play and included:

- Play the opponents' shot before they do;
- Be prepared to make a significant change to the length;
- On an end, one shot down is not necessarily damaging;
- A drill for bowling into the zone from jack high close to the jack to a meter behind.

Bowls SA Southern & Eastern SA Representative, Daniel Cocks, spoke about training programs for Umpires, Coaches and other Officials.

The members who attended reported they were pleased with what was provided.

There were few requests for direction about their personal practice from those who could not, or did not, attend.

Your Club Coaches, Michael and Graham were delighted with those bowlers from all divisions who attended, especially the sessions before Christmas. It was gratifying to see in practice, the belief that mastering practice drills would translate into shots in pennant matches.
